



Historic Preservation Grants

The DAR Historic Preservation Grants provide financial support for local community projects that preserve historic resources, sites and other history-related projects. Examples include restoration of historic buildings; digitization or preservation of documents/records; preservation of historical items/artifacts; erection of new or rededication/relocation of existing historical markers; cemetery headstone and monument conservation, etc. Additional consideration is provided to projects related to the Colonial-through-the-Federal periods, though projects from all eras are welcome to apply.

Each application must be accompanied by a DAR chapter or state organization sponsorship letter. The maximum grant amount is \$10,000.
