I am very excited to share that the Metzger Administration will be awarding "Welcome Home" Grants in 2020. Chapters may apply for grant funds that support projects that Welcome Home our Nation's veterans and current service members — whether a physical home or the home that is created through healing and purpose. Additionally, chapters may sponsor an organization applying for grant funds that directly support veterans and current service members.

These grants to benefit veterans and current service members are only available because of the generous support of Kansas daughters to the State Regent Project. The Grant application deadline is March 15, 2020. Chapters and chapters sponsoring organizations receiving grants for projects will be notified by April 15, 2020. ### **Historic Preservation Grants**

The DAR Historic Preservation Grants provide financial support for local community projects that preserve historic resources, sites and other history-related projects. Examples include restoration of historic buildings; digitization/preservation of records/documents; preservation of artifacts; erection of new or rededication/relocation of historical markers; cemetery headstone conservation, etc. Additional consideration is provided to projects related to the Colonial – Federal periods, though projects from all eras are welcome to apply.

The required application form and instructions are available on the DAR Members' website. Each application must be accompanied by a DAR chapter or state organization sponsorship letter. The maximum grant amount is \$10,000.

This is a wonderful way to fulfill our National Society's fundamental mission to promote historic preservation and demonstrate what DAR is about. Up to \$250,000 will be awarded annually and is funded by members' generous support of the General Fund.

## **Literacy Promotion Committee and Contest**

According to the most recent National Assessment of Adult Literacy, conducted by the U.S. Department of Education, as many as 1 in 7 adults



in the United States cannot read at levels necessary to succeed in today's society. Across the country, Daughters are meeting the challenge and helping those with significant literacy needs to learn to read, to gain self- respect and confidence, and to reach life goals that otherwise would not be obtainable. Here are just a few ways your chapter and individual chapter members can get involved in promoting literacy: • Seek out organizations in your community who work to promote literacy. • Partner with them to provide educational supplies, coordinate volunteer efforts, or to raise funds to promote literacy in your community. • Mentor or tutor a child, an at-risk teen, or an adult learner. • Teach English as a second language through classes or conversation sessions. • Read to the blind or record books on tape. • Provide books to hospitals, doctors offices, restaurants and other places with waiting rooms in your community.

The purpose of the Literacy Promotion Committee national contest is to recognize outstanding service by DAR members, chapters, and states in the promotion of literacy. Contest winners will demonstrate outstanding activity in at least one of the three areas of emphasis: Honor our Spirit of Partnership, Focus on Future Readers, or Celebrate the DAR's Commitment to Literacy Promotion.

Outstanding Service of a DAR Member (submit one of your chapter members!) - The DAR member must promote literacy outside of their employment or normal duties — entries are due to me by January 5, 2020. Outstanding Service of a Chapter (submit your chapter!) Chapter members may work individually or together in the promotion of literacy — entries are due to me by January 5, 2020.

Outstanding Service of a State Contest - Outstanding State Service in Literacy Promotion is accomplished through the overall effort of the members within the chapters to provide service to promote literacy. Chapters may work individually or together as a state to promote literacy – entries are due to the Literacy Promotion Division Vice Chair, Janelle DeFrees, by February 15, 2020. 


## Shawnee Mission Chapter Celebrates 70 Years

## News from the American Indians Committee

On November 1, 2019, I attended the signing of the Governor's Proclamation for American Indian Heritage Month. Also present were four tribal leaders. Those tribes represented were: the Iowa Tribe of Kansas and Nebraska; the Kickapoo Tribe in Kansas; the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation; and the Sac & Fox Nation of Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska. Also present was Chris Howell, who is the Executive Director of the native American Affairs Office within the Office of the Governor. It was a special day, and I was honored to be able to participate.

Thanks to so many of our Kansas daughters who showed continued support toward Haskell this year once again! Your generosity resulted in a pickup load and three carloads of supplies being delivered after the state meeting in September. Then the Northeast District and the Polly Ogden Chapter made their trek to Lawrence in early October with ten more carloads of needed items for the Haskell students. It was quite a caravan. Manny King and the students were very appreciative of our visit and all of the wonderful items that were donated. In response to a special request for much needed feminine products, daughters in the Northeast District responded to the challenge with an abundance of donations.

Subsequent to the October delivery, I heard from several ladies who expressed an interest in donating feminine products again at the beginning of Haskell's second semester which starts January 13, 2020. This year there are about 400 young women enrolled at Haskell so this need is great.

# Chapter Websites

As State VIS Chair, one of the areas that I am responsible for is the review of chapter websites. One of this administration's goals is to perform an audit of all KSDAR chapter websites for adherence to NSDAR rules, so please review the requirements for chapter websites.

Any chapter wishing to update their website or create a new site must send an email to me that your chapter is beginning the process. Once the design has been finalized and **before** taking the website live, send it to me for review and approval. Once approved, it will then be sent to the State Regent. Upon her approval, she will then forward to NSDAR for the final approval. Changes of email addresses, names or photos of officers and calendar updates should be reported to the State VIS Chair but do not require national approval. All other changes **must** go through the approval process.

When starting the design process, you will want to go to the DAR members page, VIS Committee, to see what NSDAR requires on all chapter websites. Also review the DAR Style Guide. This will save you time and revisions by knowing this information. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions.
