DAR Genealogy Preservation



Have you ever wondered what happens to the supporting documents you submitted as proof of eligibility when joining DAR? All those marriage certificates, baptismal reports and death records become part of the DAR's Genealogy Research System, allowing other new members to use them to help complete their applications. Simply by becoming a member you are helping to pave the way for future Daughters!

The influx of supporting documents needs to be sorted, however, to make them accessible and searchable. The DAR Genealogy Preservation committee is the team of people tasked with categorizing the records and we could use your help! This project is done on your computer and is very simple but valuable work. To take part you will sign in and ask for a set of documents. You will then be shown scanned documents, one by one, and you only need to check the box identifying each image as either a Marriage Certificate, Birth Certificate, etc. Almost no typing!

Kansas Daughters have been really productive with this project and this past year 31 Kansas Daughters categorized almost 48,000 records! But with all our new members there are millions of records waiting to be categorized and we would love to have your help.

Industrial Revolution. While many museums do not have the luxury of displaying their vast collections, the DAR Museum displays about 1/3 of its collection on average, including furniture, silver, ceramics, glass, paintings, costumes, and textiles.

State Credentials Reminder

All Chapter Regents need to be aware of the approaching deadlines for the KSDAR State Conference Credentials. The forms are due by March 16, 2020 and copies must be emailed to the State Registrar, the State Treasurer and the Credentials Chair. In order to vote, the chapter's dues must have been mailed by December 1, 2019. More information and the 2020 Credentials Form can be found on the KSDAR members website. Vietnam Veterans Day, March 29, 2020

In 2017, a Presidential Executive Order created Vietnam Veterans Day, to be celebrated on March 29 each year. On March 29, 1973, the last combat troops were withdrawn from Vietnam, and the last prisoners of war held in North Vietnam arrived on American soil. While many troops remained behind before the fall of Saigon, March 29 holds great meaning for many Vietnam War veterans.

Vietnam Veterans Day commemorates the sacrifices of Vietnam veterans and their families and is part of a national effort to recognize the men and women who were denied a proper welcome upon returning home more than 40 years ago. Generations later, veterans of this time period are gaining the respect that was not so freely given upon their return. It also pays tribute to the technology and medical advances that took place during this war.

There were 58,000 killed during this war. National Vietnam War Veterans Day recognizes the military service of these men and women who answered the call of service to their country.

How should you and your chapter observe Vietnam Veterans Day? Thank a veteran for their service and welcome them home. Buy them lunch or a beverage. Present them with a Vietnam War Commemoration Pin or other Commemoration items such as stickers or thank you notes. Visit the local VA and take healthy snack items to serve to the veterans. Work with your local VFW and/or American Legion to jointly develop a recognition program. Fly your Flag.

There were 9,087,000 military personnel that served in active duty during the Vietnam Era (August 5, 1964 – May 7, 1975), and 2,709,918 men and women served in Vietnam. Our Vietnam Veterans deserve our thanks for serving their country. Let us not forget them or those that gave the ultimate sacrifice.
