DAR Day of Service/Guinness Book of World Records Tie Blanket Challenge

October 10, 2020 is the date of the KSDAR attempt to enter the Guinness Book of World Records Tie Blanket Challenge. The goal is to create 2,020 tie blankets from **9am to 5pm on October 10**. Instructions for this project are available on the KSDAR Members Website. Even if you chapter has a project outlined for the October 11, 2020 NSDAR Day of Service, you can still participate in the Tie Blanket Project!

It is advised that those with underlying medical conditions or are elderly not participate in a group setting to reduce the risk of coronavirus. For these individuals who would still like to participate, you can make the tie blankets from home. If you are not physically able to participate or are unavailable during the project timeframe, then consider purchasing fleece and donating it to those that will be making the blankets.

Let's show the World what Kansas Daughters can do when presented with a challenge! Save your corner fleece scraps and sew them into glasses cases for veterans or nursing home residents!



The National DAR Day of Service takes place each year on or near October 11 to honor the anniversary of our National Society's founding on October 11, 1890. DAR chapters and members are encouraged to engage in meaningful service projects in their communities via this coast-to-coast collective expression of our mission to promote historic preservation, education and patriotism. Plan now to be a part of this important annual event.

Given the challenges presented by the pandemic, this year's National DAR Day of Service may look a little bit different, but I am confident that our outstanding members and chapters will find compelling ways to safely participate in worthwhile projects that will reinforce our purpose and raise awareness of DAR in local communities. Here are a few ideas:

- •Outdoor community service projects where social distancing measures can be easily maintained are a great way to participate. For example: gather donations (food, clothing, hygiene items, etc.) for those in need at a "drive-up collection" site; paint/clean the grounds/exterior of a local historic preservation; clean-up a local park or cemetery; stage a "Sea to Shine Sea" waterway cleanup through the Conservation Committee; or support our Literacy Committee by installing a "Little Free Library" in you community.
- •Virtual Service to America projects are another alternative, and they can be easily completed using Zoom (and other virtual meeting platforms). As examples: gather together online to write notes of encouragement to veterans and/or military personnel; ask each member to individually read a book to a child through some sort of video platform, then report your combined numbers; index Genealogical Records (why not have a contest to see which chapter member can compile the most?); hold an open-to-the-public Genealogy Workshop through your local library; or coordinate donations using an Amazon (or another website) wish-list to benefit a worthy cause.

130th Continental Congress

The 130th Continental Congress will be held June 23 – July 4, 2021. Imagine being in our Nation's Capital on July 4th! If Congress has been on your bucket list, then this next year's Continental Congress is a must. DAR Daughters march in the parade each year and we expect 2021 will be extra special with all the Daughters there for Congress. Join the Kansas Daughters as we celebrate the 4th of July in Washington, D.C.! More information will be coming in the following months, however, now is the time to begin planning for you hotel stay, saving, and getting your roommates. Congress Hotel Reservations

The J.W. Marriott will be the Congress hotel for the 130th Continental Congress. The room block opens for reservations on Monday, October 19, 2020, at 11 a.m. (Central). You must utilize the Passkey system with DAR's special reservation link that will be provided on Members website at 11 a.m. on Monday, October 19, 2020. All members are highly encouraged to make their reservations online with that link. It is possible to make reservations by phone at 1-800-393-2503 beginning at 11 a.m. on October 19, but you must specify that you are reserving in the "DAR General Attendees Block." Do not call the JW Marriott front desk or the general JW Marriott reservations line. Reservations made directly through the hotel are not guaranteed the DAR rate. The following nonnegotiable policies are also in effect for the 130th Continental Congress:

- 2021 DAR Hotel Rates per night is \$295 plus tax for single or double occupancy; for triple or quadruple occupancy, there will be a \$30 fee per additional occupant.
- Only one reservation for one room can be made per login/phone call.
- Cancellations can be made without incurring a fee on or before May 15, 2021. However, beginning May 16, 2021, any cancellation made for any reason will incur a required \$350 cancellation fee.
- Reservations at the JW Marriott must be made no later than **May 28, 2021**, in order to receive the DAR Rate.
- Should you choose to arrive early/stay later, please know that there are limited nights available at the DAR rate before/after the official Congress dates (June 30– July 4, 2021).

Alternate Hotel - State Plaza Hotel

A KSDAR block of rooms has been reserved at the State Plaza Hotel, six blocks from DAR Headquarters. Each room has a full-size kitchen with a grocery, liquor store and CVS located next door. Room rates are \$249 per night – July 4th evening will be \$279. Cancellations can be made up to 24-hours before check-in. To make a reservation, contact the State Plaza by phone at 202-833-6967 and tell reservations that you are with the Kansas DAR block. The hotel has a restaurant located on the main floor in addition to the kitchens in each room. Reservations must be made by May 28, 2021. For questions contact Kimberly Patrick, State Reporter.




Step-by-Step Your Time Counts!



- 3. Complete the Mission and Category boxes and any special information you would like to share.
- 4. Save your report.
- 5. From the confirmation screen you can add another activity or duplicate something you've done before. You can group repeated activities if necessary.
- 6. When you are done reporting and saving your activities and log out.

DAR E-Applications

It was overwhelming to know that over 100 daughters registered for the eApps training session that took place during the State September Meeting on Saturday, September 12, 2020 via ZOOM.

During the live question and answer period following the presentation, there were three questions that could not be fully answered. I reached out to DAR staff genealogist who oversees eApps, and she has provided the following answers:

- 1. What is the best browser to use? As for browsers Chrome or Firefox should both work fine. For Mac users Safari should not give them any problems. If they use Internet Explorer or Edge, they will run into problems with the fields not populating.
- 2. What speed internet should you have to successfully use eApps? Internet speed, we definitely say that if you have dial-up, the eApplication is not for you. These days with so many people working from home and have children going to school remotely, they may want work on the eApplication when there aren't too many other computers on-line taking up a large amount of bandwidth.
- 3. Can prospective members who want to enter as Member-at-Large use eApps? You're correct about not being able to use the eApplication when joining as member-at-large. They will definitely need to go the traditional paper route to membership. We are only set-up for joining with an eApplication through a chapter.

Thank you for your interest in the eApps process. If you have additional questions, I am happy to try and help you in any way. If you did not get a chance to view my recorded presentation at its first showing, it is not too late. Like all sessions from the Virtual SSM, it is available through the KSDAR members only website.
