Starting December 1 and going until December 31, at 12am, we are pleased to offer a Buy One Get One 50% Off Sale! In preparation for the new price in January, throughout the month of December all GEP courses will be \$100 with the option to buy one course and get another course at 50% off! Once you have successfully completed GEP 1-3 some of the activities that you will be eligible to help with include:

- 1) Being a Balcony Volunteer at Continental Congress
- Being assigned as a Volunteer Genealogist to a chapter other than your own
- 3) Providing virtual support for Supplemental applications. DAR Members can sign up for one-onone consultation by either video conference or telephone
- 4) Facilitating genealogy workshops for chapters that help with supplemental applications as well as preparing applications for new prospective members

We currently have 40 women in the state of Kansas that have completed GEP 1-3. Wouldn't it be great if we had 50 trained by the end of State Regent Susan Metzger's Administration?

# Shawnee Mission Chapter Field Trip and Marker Rededication

On October 13, 2021, as part of the Adopt-a-Marker challenge, to spotlight KSDAR, and to commemorate the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Santa Fe Trail, the Shawnee Mission Chapter organized a field trip to two Santa Fe Trail markers – one in Johnson County and one in Douglas County. Members met for lunch in the pavilion at Lanesfield School, then toured the small Johnson County Museum facility and the historic Lanesfield School. Students attended Lanesfield School from 1869 and 1963. Members gathered for a rededication of the marker, which was the second marker set in the state.

A rededication also took place at the Black Jack marker location. Black Jack was the battle site of an early Civil War battle that took place on June 2, 1856. Wagon ruts are still very visible at this location.

# Olathe Chapter 100th Anniversary Celebration



The Olathe Chapter celebrated it's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary by hosting a tea and dedicated the newly mounted Santa Fe Trail Marker at Mahaffie Farmstead and Stagecoach Stop in Olathe.

The event was attended by State Regent Susan Metzger and Honorary State Regent and Past Vice President General Pat Traffas. Pat shared an award presented to the Daughters of the American Revolution by the Santa Fe Trail Association in honor of the DAR's work to preserve the trail.

The Santa Fe Trail plaque was originally installed by the chapters located in the Northeast District in 1988 in front of the Mahaffie Farmhouse. Several years ago, the marker was removed due to needed changes at the site and was placed in storage. The Olathe Chapter purchased a new stone and had the marker restored and placed in front of the site's Heritage Center.

# Year End Reminders - CMR, CAA and Service to America

With the new year comes the wrap-up of 2021 for Chapters. The Chapter Master Report (CMR) is due before February 1, 2022. This document allows NSDAR and KSDAR to reward the good works that our Daughters do as well as have a snapshot of a chapter's health.

The Chapter Achievement Awards (CAA) is a part of the CMR and is the section where chapters provide information on membership changes, donations, and training such as Members, New Horizons, and the GEP courses. This report provides each chapter with a numerical total that will show the chapter's level of achievement. CAA levels of achievement are: Level 1 – 400+ points; Level 2 – 300 to 399points; Level 3 – 200 to 299 points.

Both the CMR and the CAA are excellent tools for chapters and committee chairs to use for planning a chapter's programs and activities.

The Service to America tally is where chapter members report their activities for the year. Daughters have until January 31, 2022 to enter their 2021 volunteer hours. Every hour counts and should be reported. The VanBuren Administration has a goal of 10,000,000 hours for their three years, so it is important to report your "meaningful service," no matter how small. "Meaningful community service" is defined as any volunteer activity that serves "God, home and country."



# Metzger Administration Welcome Home Grants

The Metzger Administration will once again be awarding "Welcome Home" Grants in 2021. Chapters may apply for grant funds that support projects that Welcome Home our nation's veterans and current service members – whether a physical home or the home that is created through healing and purpose. Additionally, chapters may sponsor an organization applying for grant funds that directly support veterans and current service members.

These grants to benefit veterans and current service members are only available because of the generous support of Kansas Daughters to the State Regent's Project. The Grant application deadline is March 15, 2022. Chapters and chapters sponsoring organizations receiving grants for projects will be notified by April 15, 2022. 
