Kimberly McLendon Lees April 10, 1963 - December 11, 2020 KSDAR Corresponding Secretary

Kimberly McLendon Lees, a truly amazing person, passed from our midst on Friday, 11 December 2020 at the MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas. She was born on 10 April 1963 into the military family of MSG (R) John and Dorothy McLendon at Fort Hood, Texas.



Kimberly married Mark Lees on 19 January 1985 at the home of her parents in Copperas Cove, Texas. Kimberly and Mark were blessed with three children: Elizabeth, Mark II, and Catherine. Always a pet-lover, Kimberly had several corgis: Shelby, Daphne, and Ivy have been part of the family since 2011.

Always an athlete, Kimberly displayed her skills from an early age. She played middle school softball as a grade schooler and was a starting athlete in every sport she played during high school. As an adult, she enjoyed playing golf, and though she seldom picked up a club, she always found her rhythm within a few swings. Kimberly learned to ski in a single evening and was a qualified ski patroller within a month. She achieved a level of skiing proficiency where she served as an instructor for the patrol, as well as the local ski school, all a testament to her athleticism and determination.

In 2011, Kimberly joined Daughters of the American Revolution through her maternal ancestors. She served two terms as the Chapter Regent of the Captain Jesse Leavenworth Chapter. Kimberly was recognized as the Kansas State Outstanding Chapter Regent in 2017 and 2018. In 2020, she was serving as the KSDAR Corresponding Secretary and the NSDAR National Vice Chair of Wreaths Across America. Through those same ancestors Kimberly became a member of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas. A lifelong enthusiast of history, Kimberly was proud of her American heritage and her country.

Kimberly worked for the Fort Leavenworth School District, USD 207, in a variety of positions for over 20 years. She retired from the school district on 1 July 2020. Her last position was Director of Transportation, Grounds and Maintenance, where she was excited by the opportunity to lead people.

Kimberly was a CPR and First Aid instructor for the Red Cross for almost 30 years. She was a truly knowledgeable and enthusiastic trainer, who taught over a thousand people in three states during her service.

Kimberly is pre-deceased by her father, John McLendon. In addition to her family above, Kimberly is survived by her mother, Dorothy McLendon; her sister Johnette (Tim) Gaines of Killeen, TX; and brother, Scott (Christine) McLendon of Copperas Cove, TX. She also had several cousins, nieces, and nephews.

Due to current restrictions, a Celebration of Life will be held in the spring of 2021 in Leavenworth, KS. Kimberly will be buried in Copperas Cove Cemetery in Texas.



With the new year comes the wrap-up of 2020 for Chapters. The Chapter Master Report (CMR) is due before February 1, 2021. This document allows NSDAR and KSDAR to reward the good works that our Daughters do as well as have a snapshot of a chapter's health.

The Chapter Achievement Awards (CAA) is a part of the CMR, and is the section where chapters provide information on membership changes, donations, and training such as Members, New Horizons and the GEP courses. This report provides each chapter with a numerical total that will show the chapter's level of achievement. CAA levels of achievement are: Level 1 – 400+ points; Level 2 – 300 to 399points; Level 3 – 200 to 299 points.

Both the CMR and the CAA are excellent tools for chapters and committee chairs to use for planning a chapter's programs and activities.

The Service to America tally is where chapter members report their activities for the year. Daughters have until January 31 to enter their 2020 volunteer hours. Every hour counts and should be reported. The VanBuren Administration has a goal of 10,000,000 hours for their three years, so it is important to report your "meaningful service," no matter how small. "Meaningful community service" is defined as any volunteer activity that serves "God, home and country."

Metzger Administration Welcome Pg. 3 Home Grants

The Metzger Administration will once again be awarding "Welcome Home" Grants in 2021. Chapters may apply for grant funds that support projects that Welcome Home our Nation's veterans and current service members – whether a physical home or the home that is created through healing and purpose. Additionally, chapters may sponsor an organization applying for grant funds that directly support veterans and current service members.

These grants to benefit veterans and current service members are only available because of the generous support of Kansas Daughters to the State Regent's Project. The Grant application deadline is March 15, 2021. Chapters and chapters sponsoring organizations receiving grants for projects will be notified by April 15, 2020. Grants in amounts between \$500 and \$2500 will be awarded. The Grant Application and the Grant Application Instruction Sheet can be found on the KSDAR members' website. Get your vaccination and prepare to travel to Washington, D.C. for Continental Congress June 30-July 4! Come and march with the DAR in the July 4th parade down Constitution Avenue. One mile or ten blocks of pure patriotism.

Send your name, the day of arrival and the day of departure, your phone number you will use in D.C., and where you are staying and with whom. If you are working on a Congress Committee, tell me which one.

Email all information to Rebecca Kline, State Vice Regent at rggkline@gmail.com. KSDAR will have a group activity in the afternoon on Monday, June 28th, at about 4:00 pm (EST), and will be having a Kansas Delegation Dinner afterwards.

If you don't have your room reservations yet, KSDAR has a block of rooms at the State Plaza Hotel, 6 blocks from NSDAR. Each room has a full-size kitchen which allows you to save money by having some meals in your room. Room cost is \$250/night and the block runs from June 27 through July 5. To make reservations call (800) 424-2859 and ask for group code 67671X DAR Kansas 2021 DC. There is a restaurant/bar in the hotel and a grocery next door. Since the JW Marriot, the official Congress Hotel is sold out, NSDAR also suggests the Marriott Metro (\$295/night and 3 miles from DAR) and the W Hotel (\$335/night and 3 miles from DAR).

Since the founding of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution in 1890, the organization has held Continental Congress, its annual national meeting, in Washington, D.C. National, state and chapter leaders as well as other members from across the world meet at the DAR National Headquarters for a week during the summer to report on the year's work, honor outstanding award recipients, plan future initiatives and reconnect with friends. The weeklong convention consists of business sessions, committee meetings, social functions, and formal evening ceremonies. These evening ceremonies, held in the historic DAR Constitution Hall, mix pomp and circumstance with moving award presentations and musical entertainment.

Beginning January 1, 2021, Genealogical Records Committee volunteers can start working toward the



necessary credits to purchase this beautiful new pin which may be worn on the official DAR ribbon.

The GRC's purpose is to collect and index unpublished source records of a genealogical nature and once prepared in the proper format, they are sent to the DAR Library for final placement.

Primary source documents found in the DAR Library continues to be a valuable resource for prospective members looking to prove their lineage for membership and to current members working on supplementals. Ensuring the vitality of the DAR Library is an important mission and you can be a part of this valuable work.

Our DAR Library is recognized as one of the finest genealogical repositories in the world and these GRC records are available to everyone through the GRS online database.

The *new* GRC pin will be available at the DAR Insignia Store later in 2021, but you can start now and work toward the 100 pages necessary to qualify for the pin. Up to five companion bars can be added for additional levels of achievement earned. Credits are earned for every submitted/approved page forwarded to this State Chair after January 1, 2021.

Revolutionary War Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

Tomb of The Unknown Soldier Revolutionary War Washington Square Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

We all know and honor the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier located at Arlington National Cemetery overlooking Washington, D.C. This national monument was built to honor all the service men and women lost during war. During April 2021, this monument will be celebrating a 100-year anniversary.

Have you often thought, do we have a monument to honor our Revolutionary War Soldiers, specifically?

One such monument, The Tomb of The Unknown Soldier Revolutionary War is a memorial that honors the thousands of soldiers who died during the American Revolution. Many of these soldiers were buried in mass graves in the square in Philadelphia. The Washington Square Planning Committee started planning the memorial in 1954 and was completed in 1957. The monument includes the eternal flame and the bronze cast statue of General George Washington in the center. Engraved on the side is an excerpt from Washington's Farewell Address, September 17, 1976. "The independence and liberty you possess are the work of joint councils and joint efforts of common dangers, suffering and success". The plaque on the tomb reads: "Beneath this stone rests a soldier of Washington's Army who died to give you liberty".

There are other memorials just as grand also for Unknown Soldiers of the American Revolution. One located in Alexandria, Virginia on the grounds of the Old Presbyterian Meeting House dedicated in 1929, one located in Bolivar, Ohio at Fort Laurens and The Tomb of the Unknown American Revolutionary War Soldiers, which was dedicated on July 4, 1976 in Rome, New York and another in Jamestown, Virginia dedicated in 2016. What a wonderful representation and remembrance for those who sacrificed so much for the United States Of America and our freedom

New Virtual Offerings from the DAR Museum

DAR Museum curators and education staff have been hard at work making parts of the collection and exhibitions available virtually. Among the many things they have been working on include a virtual exhibit and making collection information accessible in a new app.

Illuminating Design: The Decoration and Technology of E. F. Caldwell and Company, 1959-1959, opened to the public in March but the doors immediately closed due to the pandemic. The museum team worked with the web development vendor to design and launch a virtual version of the physical exhibition. This online exhibition allows visitors to view every object in the exhibition. Go to https://illuminatingdesign.dar.org to view the exhibit.

Another virtual project that is being unveiled in January is the participation in the app Smartify the world's largest museum app. This smartphone app allows users to learn more about objects in the collection whether in the building or in their own homes. Users can scan any object in the collection with their phone camera while using the app to view the object's catalog entry.

As a partner in this app, the DAR Museum will make its collection available to guests far and wide. The DAR Museum staff will continue to work hard to bring programs, tours, and collection items to DAR members whether in person or at home.
